## **VA EHRM Researcher Spotlight**

Michael Weiner, MD, MPH (Multiple PI, PROVEN Hub – Health Informatics Core)
Scientist, VA HSR&D Center for Health Information and Communication
Professor of Medicine, Indiana University School of Medicine



Michael Weiner, MD, MPH is the Health Informatics CORE Lead for the Coordinating Hub to Promote Research Optimizing Veteran-centric EHR Networks (PROVEN). He is a Scientist with the VA HSR&D Center for Health Information and Communication in Indianapolis, Indiana, Dr. Weiner's clinical and healthservices research focuses on measuring and improving the quality, coordination, and delivery of health services, especially for older adults. He studies the effects of health information and information technology on behaviors, clinicians' practices, and patients' outcomes. He has conducted studies of specialty referral, patientphysician videoconferencing, and other forms of telecommunication to improve health care. Study methods have included cohort studies, clinical trials. surveys, and focus groups. Current research includes

the development, implementation, and study of information systems to promote clinical handoffs, management of medications, patient-centered care, health information exchange, and clinical decision support.

# VA EHRM Partner Spotlight National EHRM Supplemental Staffing Unit (NESSU)

The National EHRM Supplemental Staffing Unit (NESSU) is a group of VA clinicians who support facilities going live with the new EHR by providing: 1) peer support to help facility employees understand and use the new EHR, 2) direct patient care to offload facility employee work while they adjust to the new EHR, and 3) assistance with manual data migration—again, to ease the burden on facility employees. Most NESSU services are provided remotely by clinicians located across the country, but some NESSU clinicians arrive to provide assistance in person.

NESSU was originally created to provide direct patient care and data migration assistance but came to provide peer support based on their experience using the new EHR at multiple facilities, and their familiarity with the legacy system. NESSU has now partnered with EMPIRIC QUERI to study its impact, building upon emerging qualitative findings indicating that users at early transition sites valued NESSU support and found it to be an important complement to vendor-led training and troubleshooting.
