Evidence review of EHR transitions: Implications for VA's implementation of Cerner Millennium

Wednesday, June 23, 2021, 12:00 pm EDT

The Coordinating Hub to Promote Research Optimizing Veteran-centric EHR Networks (PROVEN) supports and facilitates research and evaluation related to VA electronic health record (EHR) modernization. In this cyberseminar, PROVEN investigators will provide preliminary findings from their evidence mapping of literature describing EHR-to-EHR transitions. The ultimate goal of this work is to describe measures and metrics used in the transition process, including measures of transition success, capture existing research and gaps for future investigation, and to inform the research agenda for moving forward in this area. We will then put these findings into real-world context during our discussion with VA operational leadership, to highlight the potential impacts and implications of the existing evidence and future work.

VA EHRM Researcher Spotlight

Kristina Cordasco, MD, MPH, MSHS



Dr. Kristina M. Cordasco is a Core Investigator in VA's Health Services Research and Development (HSR&D) Center for the Study of Healthcare Innovation, Implementation, and Policy (CSHIIP); Internal Medicine physician in the Division of General Internal Medicine at VA Greater Los Angeles (GLA) Healthcare System; and Clinical Professor of Medicine, in the David Geffen School of Medicine at the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA). Dr. Cordasco's research and quality improvement work focus on organization and coordination of care across patient transitions, including electronic medical record-based tools for improving and assessing care coordination following emergency department (ED) visits, hospital discharge, and between specialists and primary care. She led the development of the ED-PACT Tool, a mechanism for electronically communicating, via VA's Computerized Patient Record System (CPRS), Veterans' urgent or

specific follow-up care needs following VA ED visits. Dr. Cordasco is currently leading a PROVEN pilot assessing Cerner Millennium's impact on the specialty care referral process, with special attention to patient safety, specialty care access, and provider satisfaction, productivity and efficiency.
