Community Care Mammograms: Care Coordination Barriers and Facilitators and Clinical Informatics Solutions

Presenter: Kristen Gray, PhD, MS

Discussants: Caitlin Cusack, MD, MPH, FACOG & Ann Guillory, BSN, RN, CLC Most VA facilities do not offer on-site mammography and refer mammograms to community providers, requiring involvement of several VA service lines and coordination with community providers, which can be challenging. The goal of this research was to understand current care coordination practices and identify barriers and facilitators to care coordination, as well as characterize the availability of mammogram care coordination data in the CPRS/VistA electronic health record (EHR). This presentation will describe findings from interviews with 44 key stakeholders across 10 VA sites and from chart annotation of 500 completed mammograms referred to community providers.

VA EHRM Researcher Spotlight

April Savoy, PhD



Dr. April Savoy serves as a co-investigator in the PROVEN Health Informatics Core, where she coleads the Human-centered Design team. Her research interests include the application of human factors engineering to develop, evaluate, and implement socio-technical interventions that will increase efficiency of clinical workflows, enhance care coordination, and improve the quality of healthcare delivery. She has more than 13 years of experience in human factors engineering from industry and academia. Her work has focused on designing information technologies that enhance situational awareness and decision-making across domains including ecommerce, gaming, and military. Since 2014, she has applied her human factors engineering expertise and multi-domain experience to healthcare. Dr. Savoy has developed and evaluated socio-technical interventions that

better support and inform healthcare decision-making by healthcare professionals across care settings.

Her recent work assessed the use of health information technologies in clinical workflows, including consultation referrals, medication reconciliation, and hospitalist rounding. Dr. Savoy's research provides foundational evidence for implementing the user-centered design process for future health information technologies that support healthcare professionals.

Dr. Savoy obtained degrees in computer science from Xavier University of Louisiana (B.S.) and Purdue University (M.S.). Her degree in industrial engineering is from Purdue University (PhD).

EHRM Patient Safety & Human Factors Research Workgroup
