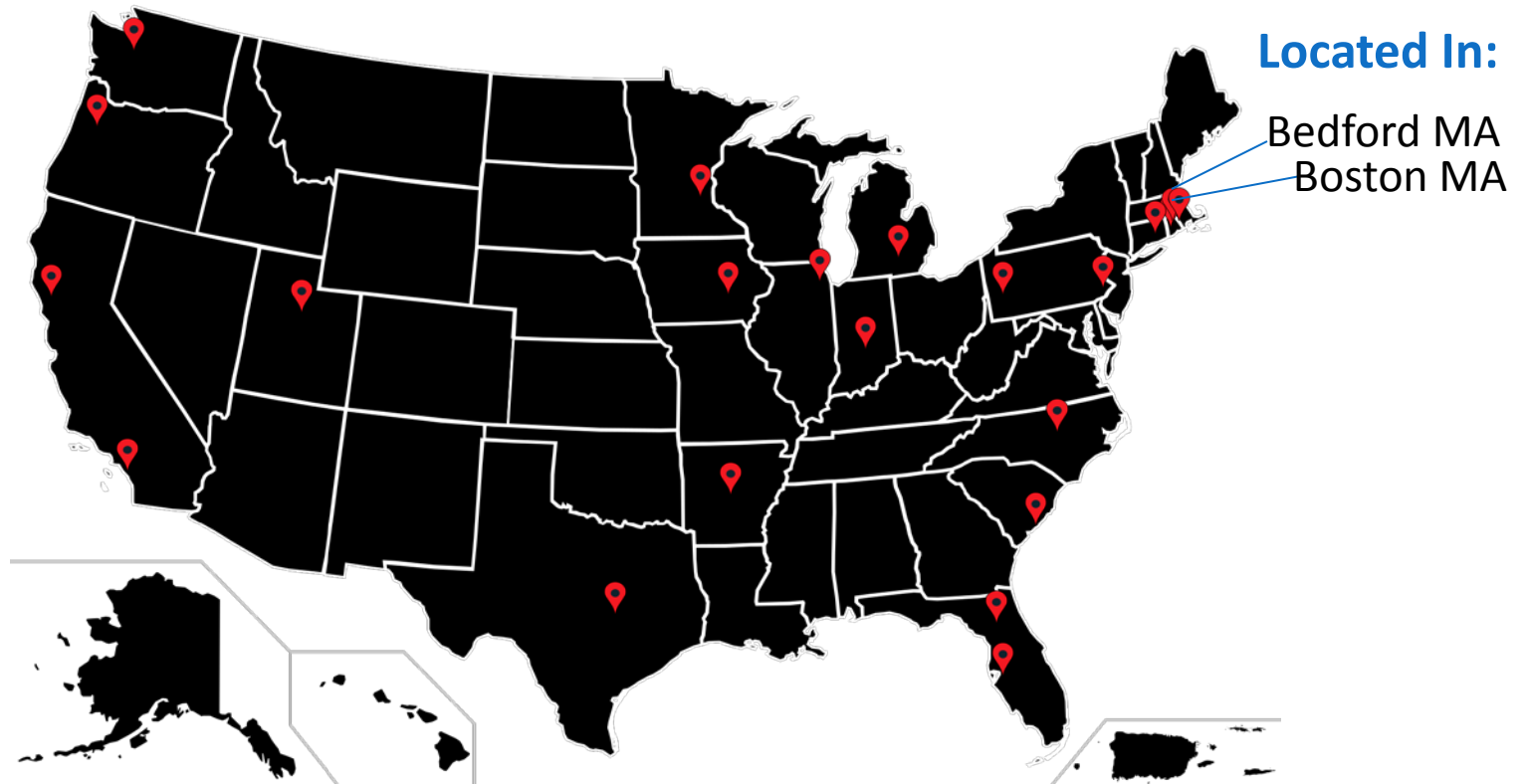

# Center for Healthcare Organization and Implementation Research (CHOIR)

Our mission is to improve Veterans' health and well-being by developing, studying, and applying evidence-based practices that are used across VA and community settings.

# **CHOIR** is the largest of 19 VA Centers of Innovation in the country



# CHOIR's Focus:

Conducting *health services research* to improve the responsiveness of the VA to those we serve, by:

- Examining the organization, delivery, and financing of health care
- Gathering perspectives of patients, caregivers, providers, and managers
- Improving the quality and economy of care and health outcomes

# Medication Optimization

1. Examine **how & why certain medications are used** throughout VA
2. Estimate **benefits and harms** of medications as used in VA
3. Develop and study strategies to **promote higher-quality use of medications to improve health** for Veterans



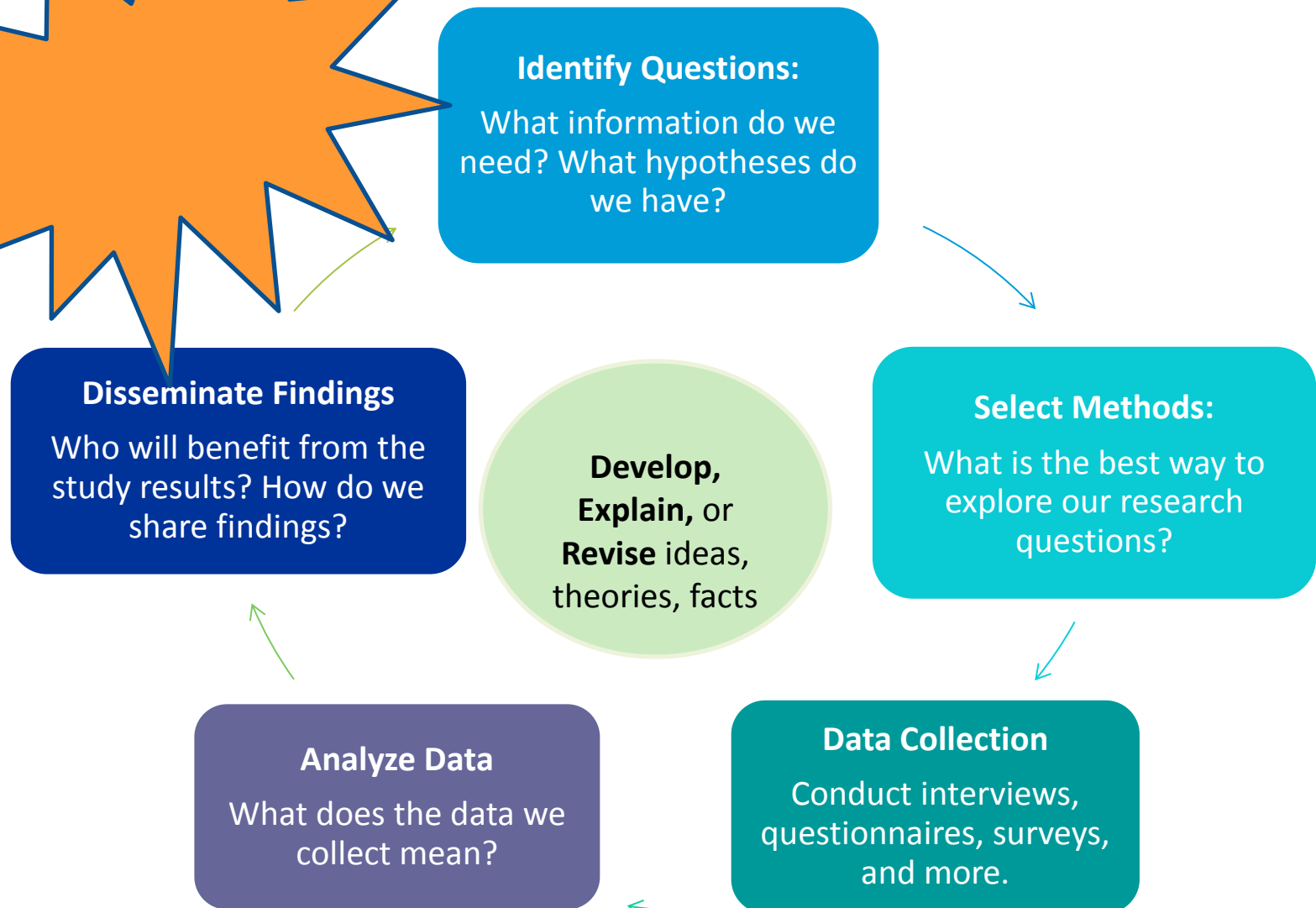
# Recovery

1. Define recovery, **develop a common approach, and measure** recovery orientation of programs
2. Develop interventions **to support vulnerable Veterans** with mental health and substance use concerns
3. Examine how **to improve the delivery of recovery-oriented care** in mental health and substance use treatment clinics and community settings

# Health Communication

1. Identify, test, and implement strategies for **better provider-patient communication**
2. Develop and spread **innovative technology that supports communication** between providers and Veterans
3. Inform and motivate Veterans to **change harmful health behaviors** and exchange information about health priorities

- Training program for PhD and MD researchers

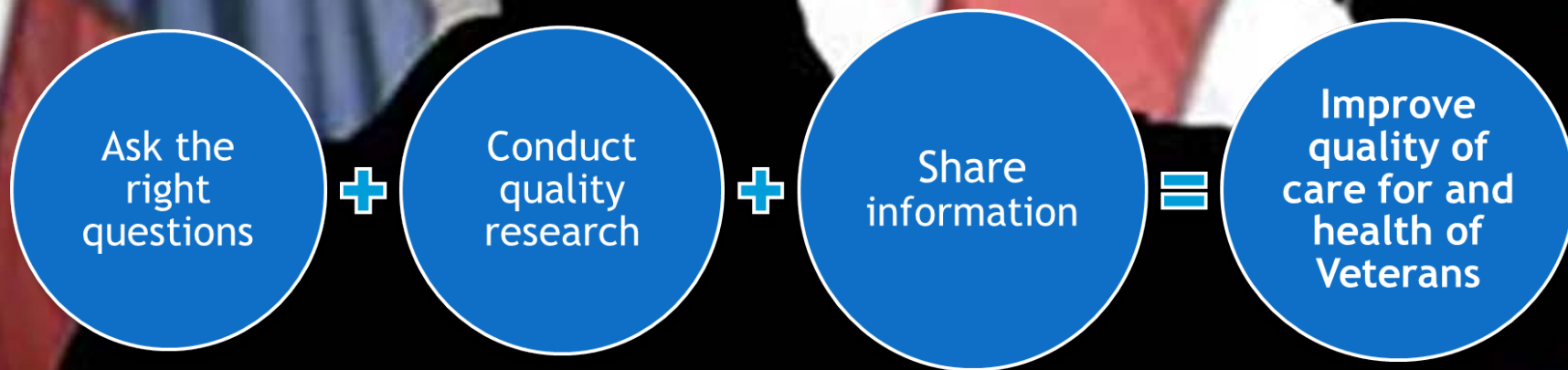
## RESEARCH STAFF

# Our hope is that involving Veterans in research will help:

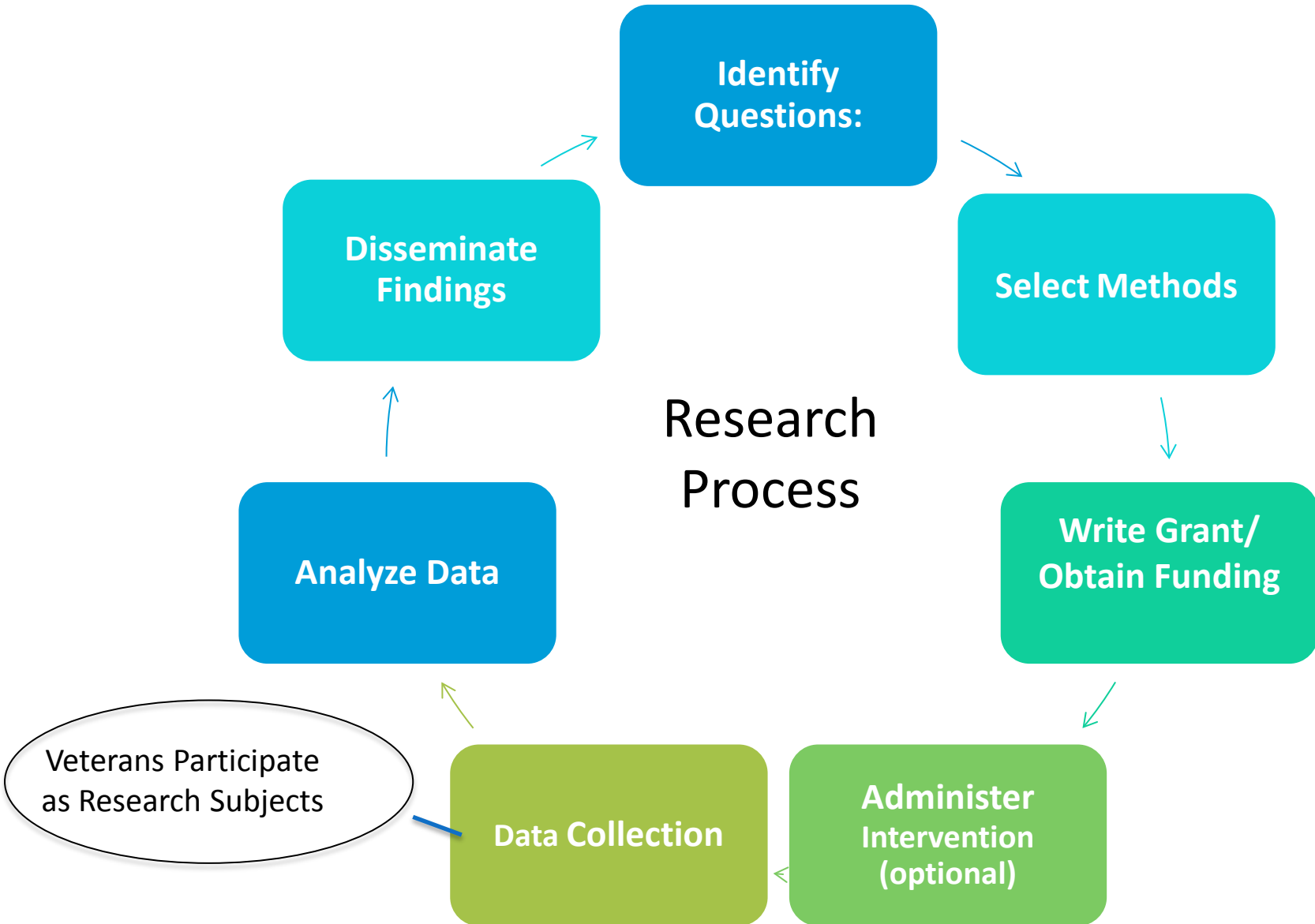
- Expand our capacity to develop useful, relevant, patient-centered research

- Improve the VA's healthcare system through research



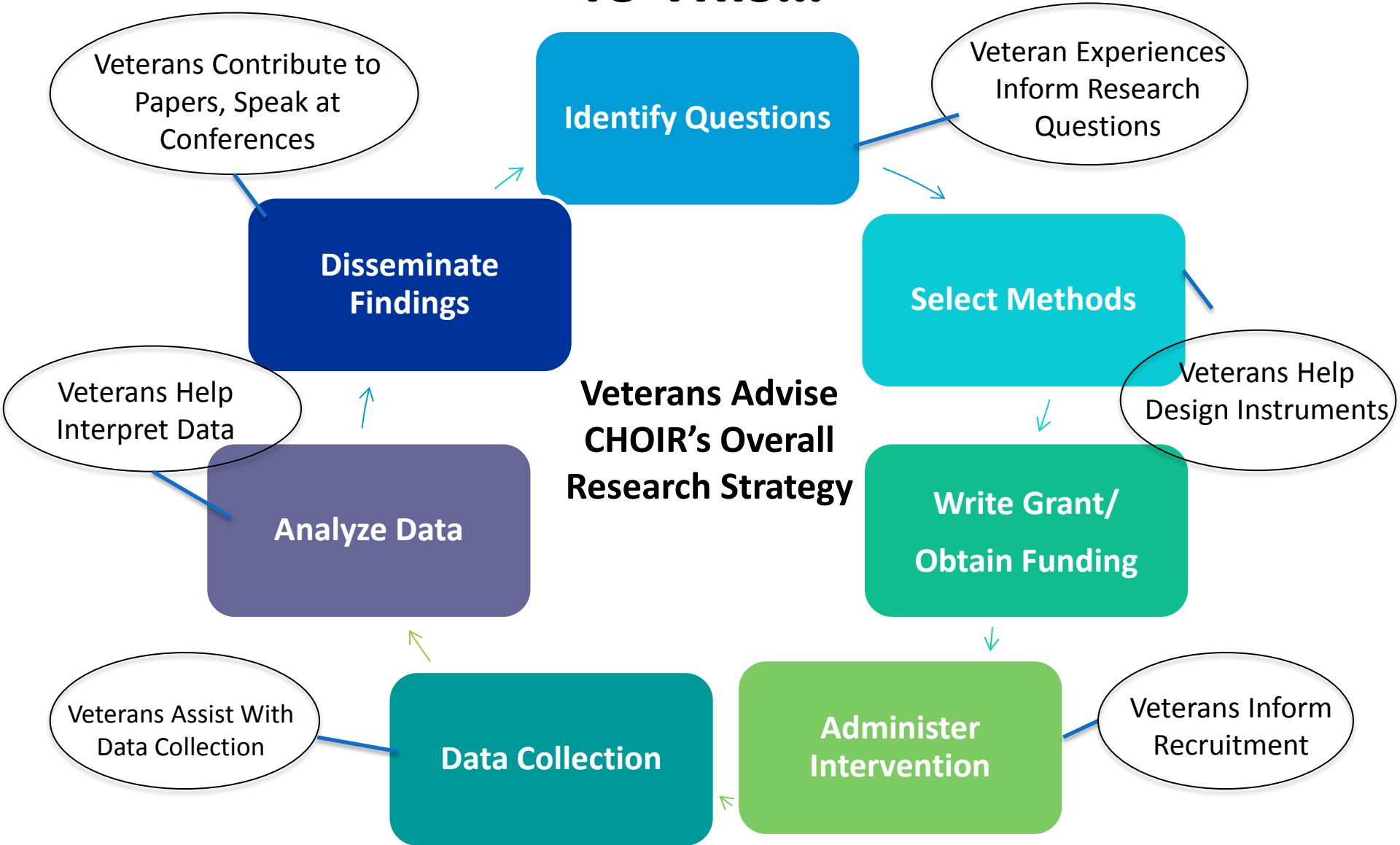
# ...HOW?

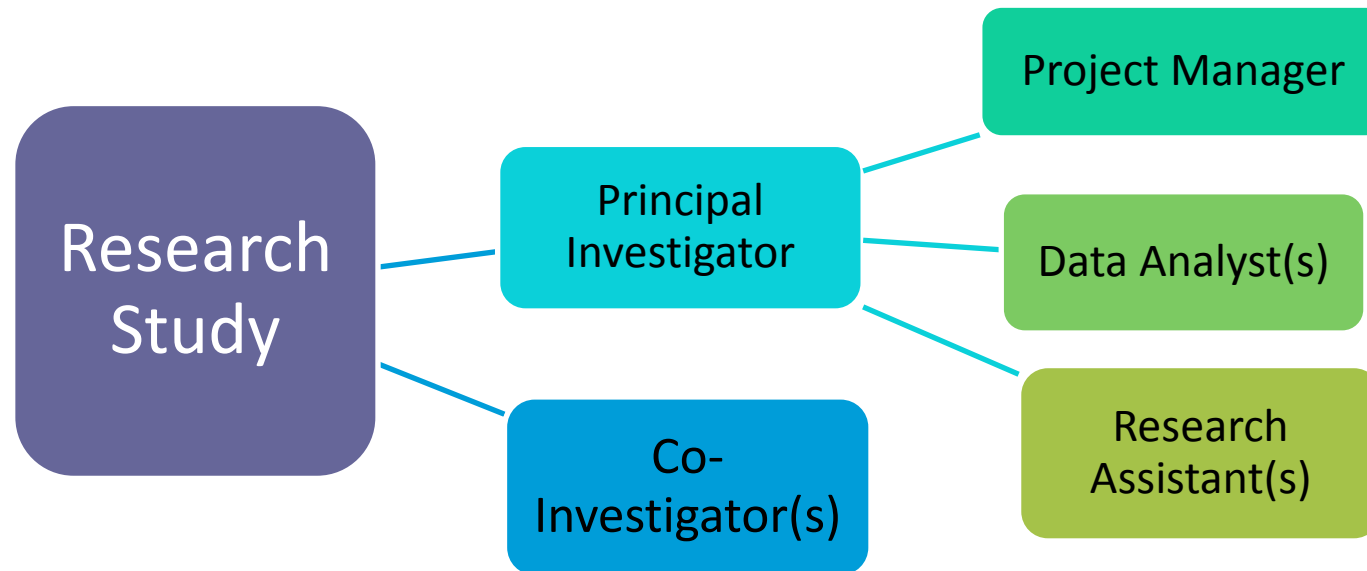

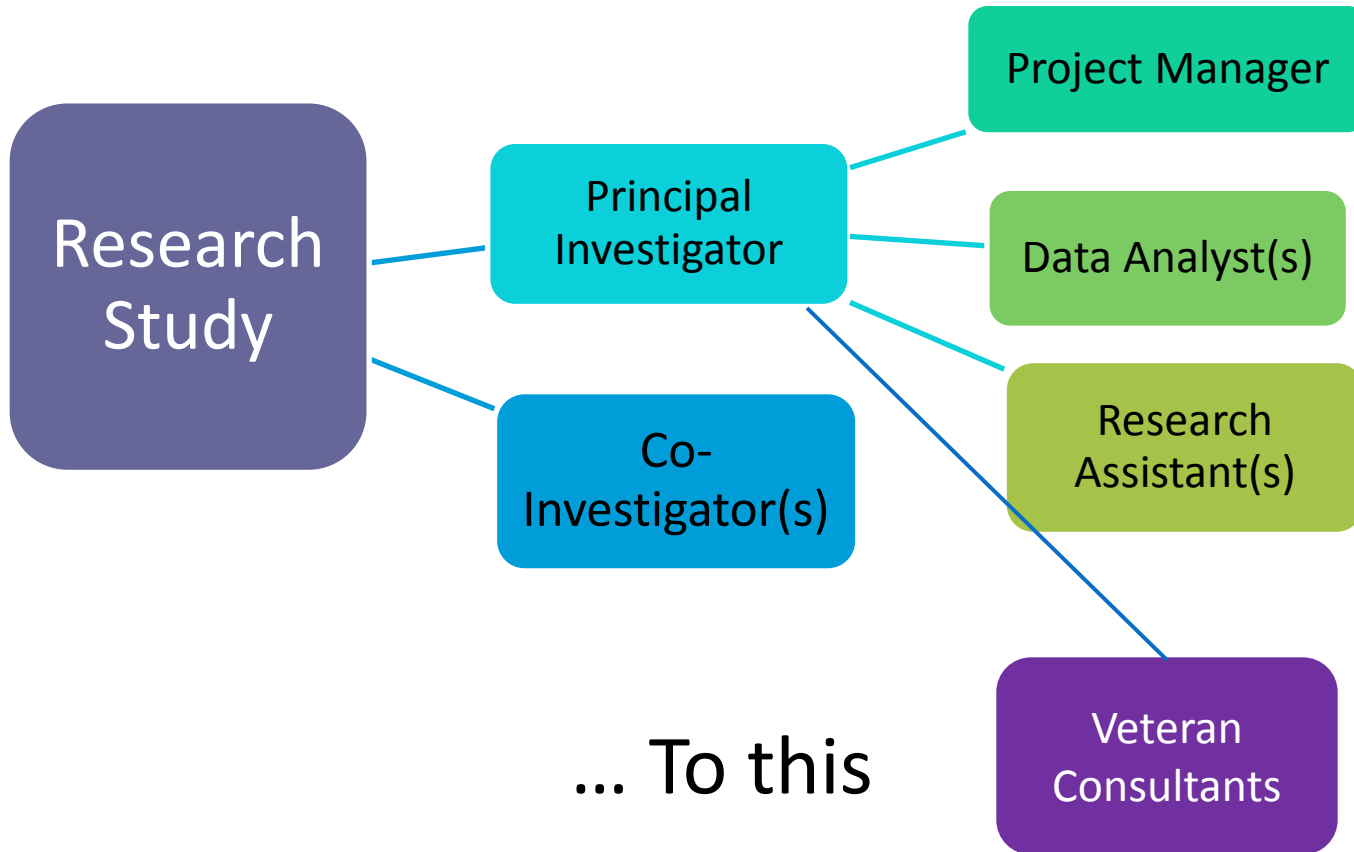
