Since our launch, we have been working hard to establish our network of investigators which is now comprised of 210 members. We held a successful Kick-Off Meeting in October 2020, and have issued two Requests for Applications (RFAs) for Office of Connected Care-funded projects. Finally, we are working to build our relationships with the other existing COREs. To that end, we are planning a joint cyberseminar with the Access CORE which is scheduled for March 3.
