Funding opportunity for VA investigators at non-COIN Sites: SWIFT-IVI

The Small aWard Initiative For impact – Independent VA Investigators (SWIFT—IVI) program invites eligible VA investigators at non-COIN sites to apply for up to \$50,000 in pilot project support during VA fiscal year 2024. This program will support preliminary projects informing future, more extensive HSR&D merit review and/or career development proposals. The goal of the SWIFT program is to provide funds for collecting and analyzing preliminary data for future proposals or preparatory research activities leading to larger HSR&D and QUERI merit-review submissions. This program is supported by HSR&D and administered by the Center for Mental Healthcare and Outcomes Research (CeMHOR) COIN at the Central Arkansas Veterans Healthcare System. See the attached Word

document for all details. The application deadline to submit for this cycle is Friday, August 18, 2023. An email of intent (EOI) is required in order to submit an application. The EOI must be submitted by July 7, 2023. To submit an EOI, please follow the steps below:

- 1) Send an email to Mary.Bartnik@va.gov and Danielle.Peters@va.gov.
- 2) Use in your subject line: SWIFT-IVI EOI.
- 3) Include in the email:
 - Principal Investigator information
 - Name
 - VA affiliation and title
 - Include 5-6 keywords about the research topic you plan to study.
 - 4-6 sentences about your research plan.
 - 2-3 sentences specifying the planned future funding application that the award would make possible.
 - 1 sentence stating how much protected time the Pl's supervisor will allow the Pl to dedicate to the project.

Study: Assessing Collaborative Research Networks to Enhance Research Value

To better understand what individual and environmental factors contribute to successful collaborative research, Dr. Elizabeth Stevens at NYU Langone Health is conducting a research study that will collect information about our consortium's members and their collaboration networks.

The study will last approximately 5 years and involve several parts including a baseline survey, the possibility of a one-time 60-minute interview, and four follow-up surveys. The surveys ask about your background, personality, perceptions of collaborative research, research productivity, and collaboration networks. All study activities are 100% optional. Funding Opportunity From the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute (NHLBI)

This Notice of Special Interest (NOSI) aims to support research that generates evidence on the real-world effectiveness of telehealth collaboration among healthcare providers for consultation, second opinions, and other purposes, referred to as provider-to-provider telehealth (PPT). PPT offers remote access to critical health expertise that might not exist locally in certain communities. The funding has co-participation of the National Cancer Institute (NCI) and the Office of Disease Prevention (ODP), and is inspired by the gaps and opportunities identified by the 2022 Federal Partners Meeting Report, and the NIH's "Improving Rural Health Through Telehealth-Guided Provider-to-Provider Communication" Workshop.

Research supported by this NOSI is expected to:

- 1. Contribute to the advancement of health equity and access to care in rural communities through implementation research focused on telehealth-guided provider-to-provider communication;
- 2. Stimulate evidence-based interventional and observational research to investigate the real-world effectiveness of provider-to-provider telehealth in managing the health of rural populations while observing, gathering, and assessing information on implementation;
- 3. In settings where evidence of clinical effectiveness of PPT is robust, develop and test implementation strategies while observing and gathering information on the intervention's impact on relevant outcomes.
