What is USVETS?

- All US Veterans: Veteran military history, demographics, socioeconomics, and utilization of VA benefits and services
- Contains 250+ variables, integrates data from 35+ VA and federal data sources, and contains over 38 million records (and growing).





Why is USVETS produced?


- To support operational and policy issues throughout the Department of Veterans Affairs
 - Their focus is larger than the Veterans Health Administration
 - USVETS is their primary data source for the DGA
- Examples of their work:
 - VetPop: official Veteran population projection from the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). VetPop is used for strategic, policy planning, and budgeting within VA and by external organizations such as other federal agencies, Congress, state governments.
 - Women Veterans Report: This report summarizes the history of women in the military and as Veterans, who our women Veterans are, how their military service affects their post-military lives, and how they can be better served based on these insights.



How is USVETS produced?

- Acquired from over 35 data sources including...
 - Department of Defense (DoD)
 - Veterans Health Administration (VHA)
 - National Cemetery Administration (NCA)
 - Veterans Benefits Administration (VBA)
 - Social Security Administration (SSA)
- Aggregated by a transparent data quality framework
- Hosted on the BISL SAS grid (currently non-research)

Data Quality

- “USVETS must be considered the gold standard for Veteran data.” United States Veterans Eligibility Trends and Statistics (USVETS) Support USVETS Data Quality Assessment Version 3.1, 20 MAR 2019
- Issues with aggregating multiple data sources
 - Multiple data sources contain the same data element → transparent adjudication process including limitations
 - Single data source contains unique data element → data may be unavailable for some of the study population
- Operate within a data quality framework: accuracy, completeness, consistency, traceability, uniqueness, validity, and timeliness

- All categorical variables from multiple data sources in USVETS
- USVETS generally chooses the most representative value
- They may impute unknown values (e.g., name → gender)

Validity

- Does the data make sense?
 - An address has a state abbreviation that does not exist
 - The Veterans activation date was prior to their birth
- Does the data conform to business rules?

Timeliness

USVETS is comprised of many different data sets sourced from VA, other Government agencies, and external organizations. These files are sent to or acquired by DGA following the schedule in Table 7.

The timely availability of source data is often out of the control of DGA and has been delayed several months in some cases. Currently, DGA does not officially measure the timeliness of source data.

Completeness, Consistency, Traceability, Uniqueness

- **Completeness:** contextual to the variables
 - A missing date of death could mean the Veteran is alive.
- **Consistency**
 - If the Veterans is known to be dead, but lacks a date of death
- **Traceability:** original data source
- **Uniqueness:** single record per SSN

Limitations


- USVETS is designed for population-based assessments, not individuals
 - Race and ethnicity may come from purchased data sources, if no better source exists
 - Researchers may prefer CDW for race and ethnicity
 - USVETS had Social Security Administration (SSA) review SSN, name, gender, and DOB
 - Gender may be determined from the name, if no data source exists

How is USVETS data arranged?

- Statistical Analysis System (SAS) data sets
- One dynamic file per fiscal year (n=13; FY2005–2017)
- One master file




Where Veterans Live

- Where do they live?
 - State name, abbreviation, state FIPS code
 - County name, county FIPS code
 - ZIP & ZIP+4 codes
 - Latitude/longitude of their place of residence
- Community information
 - Rural-urban commuting area (RUCA) codes
 - Y/N – is their living area considered urban?
 - Congressional district of residence
 - VISN code/market/sector/submarket
 - Distance from VA inpatient and outpatient facilities






Who Lives with Veterans

- Home owner or renter
 - O = Owner
 - R = Renter
- Number of people in Household
 - Single parent?
 - Children?
 - Seniors?
- Age ranges of adults and children in household



Percent of Veteran Household's with Children



Veteran Finances

- Are they considered competent to receive payments directly? Y/N
- Do they receive compensation/pension from VA? Y/N
- Estimated household income – range and dollar amount



Veteran Education & Employment

- Highest education level:
 - 1 = Completed high school
 - 2 = Completed college
 - 3 = Completed graduate school
 - 4 = Attended vocational/technical school
- Does the Veteran own a business? If so, what type?
 - A, B, C, D, E, F, M, O, P, S – alpha codes for type
- Occupational information: alphanumeric code detailing the occupation of the individual
 - E.g. A000, G002



Health Insurance

- Health insurance coverage indicator – calculation based on multiple demographic variables to determine the propensity of having major medical insurance
- Active health insurance in FY, private or Medicare – Y/N
- Life insurance user indicator – Y/N if SSN in VGLI/VALI
- VA insurance policy amount – \$\$\$ amount
- VHA active insurance – Y/N
- Medicare enrollment – Y/N if enrolled in parts A/B/C/D

Benefits & Utilization

- Number of service-connected conditions
- Did the veteran use one or more VA benefits or services?
- Date the veteran enrolled in healthcare benefits
- What kind of care did the Veteran receive in the FY?
 - Inpatient/outpatient, VA and non-VA
 - How many times and for how long?
- Care cost information:
 - Numerical value of VA inpatient and outpatient care
 - Numerical value of non-VA inpatient and outpatient care
- Pharmacy utilization
 - Did the veteran receive VA pharmacy care in the FY?
 - How much cost incurred by inpatient pharmacy?
 - How much cost incurred by outpatient pharmacy?


