



Patient-Centered Screening for Homelessness and Housing Instability: A Veteran-Facing Graphic Medicine Booklet



Not all Veterans experiencing homelessness connect with VHA Homeless Programs



Findings from the HSR&D study “Identifying and Measuring Risk for Homelessness among Veterans” (PI: Montgomery) showed the need for patient-centered interventions to improve the HSCR screening experience and educate Veterans who screen positive about the referral and service linkage process.

Every VA is different, so check with your local VHA Homeless Program representative for information on the availability of these programs and eligibility requirements or visit www.va.gov/homeless.

Domiciliary Care for Homeless Veterans (DCHV)
Residential housing programs that provide a structured, supportive environment for veterans struggling with chronic health issues, mental health or substance use issues.

Grant and Per Diem (GPD)
Community housing programs that typically offer a room with a bed in a safe facility, and often provide on-site case-management, counseling, education, and employment services.

Health Care for Homeless Veterans (HCHV)
Program providing outreach, case management, and community based residential services to ensure Veterans experiencing homelessness have access to VA and community programs.

Homeless Veteran Community Employment Services (HVCES)
Employment program where VA helps you connect with community organizations and employers.

Housing and Urban Development-Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing (HUD-VASH)
Permanent housing that combines rental assistance vouchers from HUD with VA supportive services, which can help you connect with health care, mental health treatment, substance use counseling, and other supportive services.

Supportive Services for Veterans and Families (SSVF)
Community programs funded by VA provide homelessness prevention and rapid rehousing assistance and may be able to help you with an eviction notice, or with temporary rent and utility payments, as well as connect with other services in your community.

VHA Justice Programs
Connects Veterans in homeless or mental health programs with legal services that

DID YOU KNOW?
You may be eligible for homeless services even if you are not eligible for healthcare at the VA.

Goals:

- Helps destigmatize homelessness
- Informs reader about options
- Provides immediate resources
- Locates local, professional support

Your doctor noted in your health record that you've been living in a shelter. My job is to help you learn about services that might help you.

Tell me what's going on and we'll discuss some options.

When I left the military, I had a really hard time being around people. I couldn't hold a job, I slept in a tent for a while, and now I feel I've worn out my welcome at the shelter.

I'm not sure what to do or where to go.

You came to the right place, Barry. First, lets talk about some of the programs that you may be eligible for, and we'll come up with a plan. We can also connect you with a counselor who can support you through this difficult time.

Norm can't be everywhere, but there is someone like him at most VA facilities across the country.

4. How do I get these booklets printed?

The booklets are designed to be printable on standard legal-sized paper. You can request a digital copy of the booklet by emailing Raymond.facundo@va.gov, and we'll send high-resolution files to your facility's Medical Media office or VA-approved printing service. VHA facilities across the country are structured differently, so printing services may not be available on site. Your first point of contact to get these printed should be your facility's Communications & Public Relations office. They will need to approve the document and authorize distribution.



Specifications for Professional Print-shops:

File type: PDF

Layout: Single pages (Not spreads), 8.5"x7" (half legal), no bleeds, with a .25 white border around each page to account for the available printing area.

Color: CMYK

5. How do I customize booklet for my facility?


The booklet was designed to be customized for each facility by leaving a space for a printable label to be fixed to the back. Each label should list two points of contact for entry into services. An example is provided below. The first person listed should be the individual or office that VA staff members all point to when they encounter a Veteran who is experiencing homelessness. The second point of contact should be a community social services office or shelter that provides Coordinated Entry into care.




Card type	Example
Critical phone numbers	Veterans Crisis Line
Positive affirmations	I am worth it.
Connect with others	Say something kind to someone.
Grounding	Feel your heart beating. Feel your feet on the ground.
Distress tolerance	Feeling stressed in a situation? Slowly count to 10, then decide what to do.
Hope	I've made it to today – what has helped me get here?
Take care of yourself	It's ok to call your health care team to check in. _____ Write their number here.




INNOVATION INVESTMENT PROGRAM

FY21 Spark-Seed-Spread Timeline







- Find your cheerleaders to help you push through hurdles and persist to the end
- Identify and articulate the “why” (problems ‘on the ground’), and address with creativity and passion
